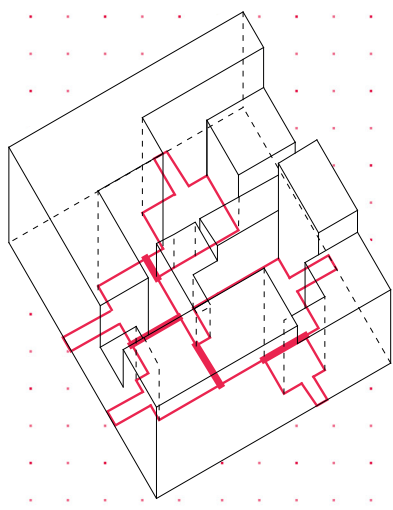
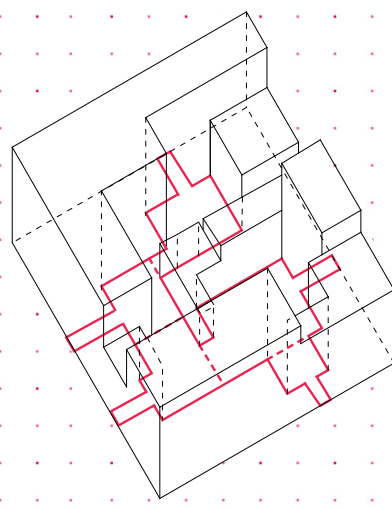

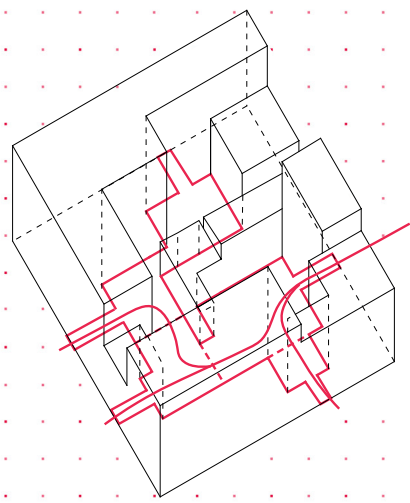
1. STATE OF ART

Urban courtyards divided by property walls



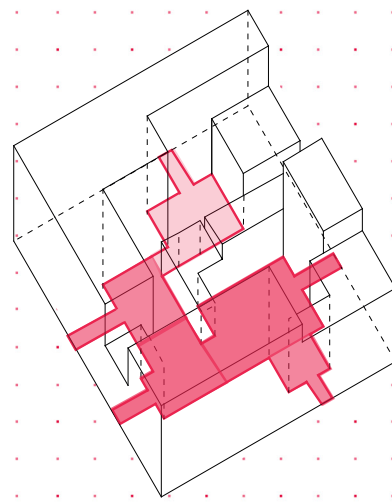
2. LINK THE COURTYARDS

Rethink the dividing walls between the courtyards to create possible paths and connections



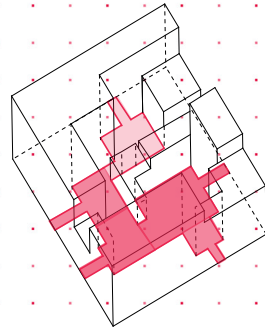
3. DEFINITION OF FLOWS
