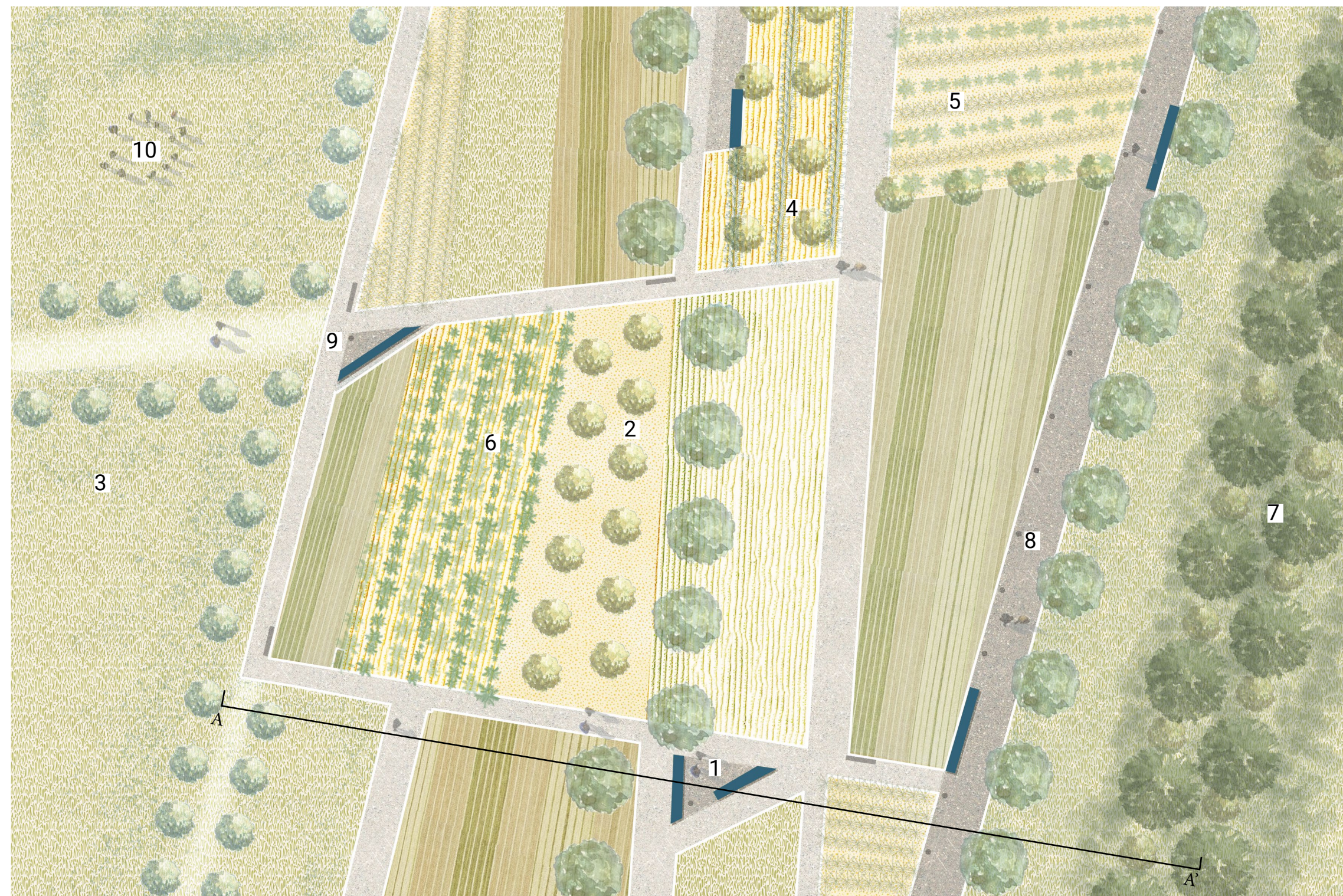
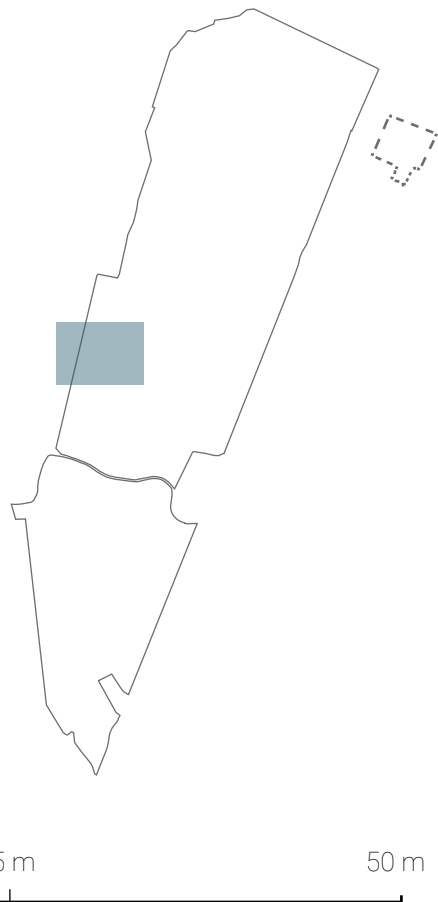


05 The discovery garden - Design focus 1

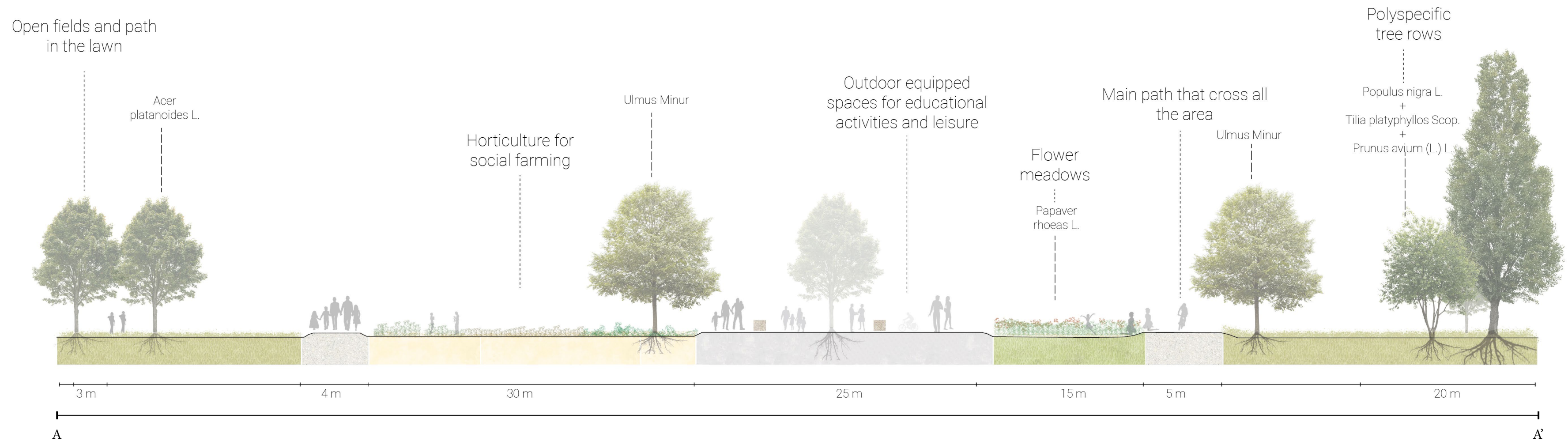
